1. Print dress on white cardstock, print other pages (skirts) on white/colored/patterned paper or cardstock.
2. Cut along the outside edge of dress and skirt layers.
3. Add each layer of skirt behind the full dress and staple together at the waist.

Optional Bonus Instructions:

- Print skirt pieces on colored cardstock or patterned paper, however the first page (dress) is meant to be on white cardstock because it's a Temple dress.
- Use your own ribbon and add it to the dress.
- Embellish dress as desired, keeping in mind that this is to symbolize a Temple Dress.
